Transportation Research Program Goals

Improve agency processes and materials through quality research

- Make a real and positive impact on agency programs and through the agency, the traveling public
- Projects should be of good quality and produce useful, implementable or transferable results

Implementation / Tech Transfer

- Provide support to implement state and national research
- This may include training, documentation and demonstration projects

Workforce Development

- Students and researchers working on projects will enter the workforce with a deeper understanding of WV transportation needs

Transportation Research Program Goals

Communication and Outreach

- Maintain consistent communication within the agency and external partners
- Develop a communication plan for newsletters

National Exposure

- Presentations by WV-based researchers and DOT staff at state and national meetings
- Participation in national opportunities such as AASHTO committees, Transportation Research Board activities and national conferences

Certification

- Update and maintain a robust Research Manual to meet all requirements and document current processes
- Assist the agency in documentation and certification for its SPR Part B Program



SP&R Part B Research Funding

Highway Program Apportionment

- West Virginia receives approximately \$600M of Federal Funding per year in total highway apportionment funds

2% of the total must be dedicated to State Planning and Research – SP&R

- Of that, 2%, 25%, or 0.5% of the total apportionment is dedicated to SP&R Subpart B for research.
- Matching funds of 20% are required, like many highway funding programs
- WVDOT Pooled Fund participation does not require a state match
- SP&R funds currently do not sunset, however, they are subject to annual obligation authority rules and if not expended, could be subject to rescission
- States must certify their SP&R Programs Annually

Approximate West Virginia SP&R Subpart B Formula Appropriation by Federal Fiscal Year

2025	\$ 2.90 M	\$ 0.73 M	\$ 3.63 M

2027	\$ 3.10 M	\$ 0.78 M	\$ 3.88 M

These are the funds that can be used for internal and external research projects and research implementation



What's a Pooled Fund?



From the Pooled Fund website:

- The TPF Program is a collaborative program that has existed for more than 45 years.
- The program was first defined in 1977 as a program among the states to be administered by FHWA
- The TPF program creates an opportunity for partners to pool their funds, subject matter expertise, and resources to conduct high-priority research to meet a wide variety of shared transportation problems.
- *Being able to pool funds allows participants to get more out of a study than if they conducted a study on their own. Example: 20 states x \$75,000 is \$1.5M in funding.*
- There are hundreds of active pooled fund studies, to help assist partners in finding and funding projects applicable to their agency's needs.





WVDOT/FHWA Discovery Session Findings

Attendee Experience

- Session attendees shared their past experiences with the Research Program, including past research projects and other Research Program tasks they contributed to
- It was noted that completing projects on time has been a challenge in the past, and steps to mitigate this should be implemented

Pooled Fund Participation

- Attendees showed interest in participating in various Pooled Funds including:
 - *Steel Bridge Research, Inspection, Training, and Engineering Program (SBRITE)*
 - *Concrete Technology Transfer Consortium*
 - *International Conference on Ecology and Transportation*





WVDOT/FHWA Discovery Session Findings

Committee Structure

- Project Steering, Technical, and Executive Committees will review and make decisions regarding research projects
- Mott MacDonald will propose a committee structure that meets the needs of WVDOT
- Individuals will be recommended for committee positions by WVDOT

Research Needs

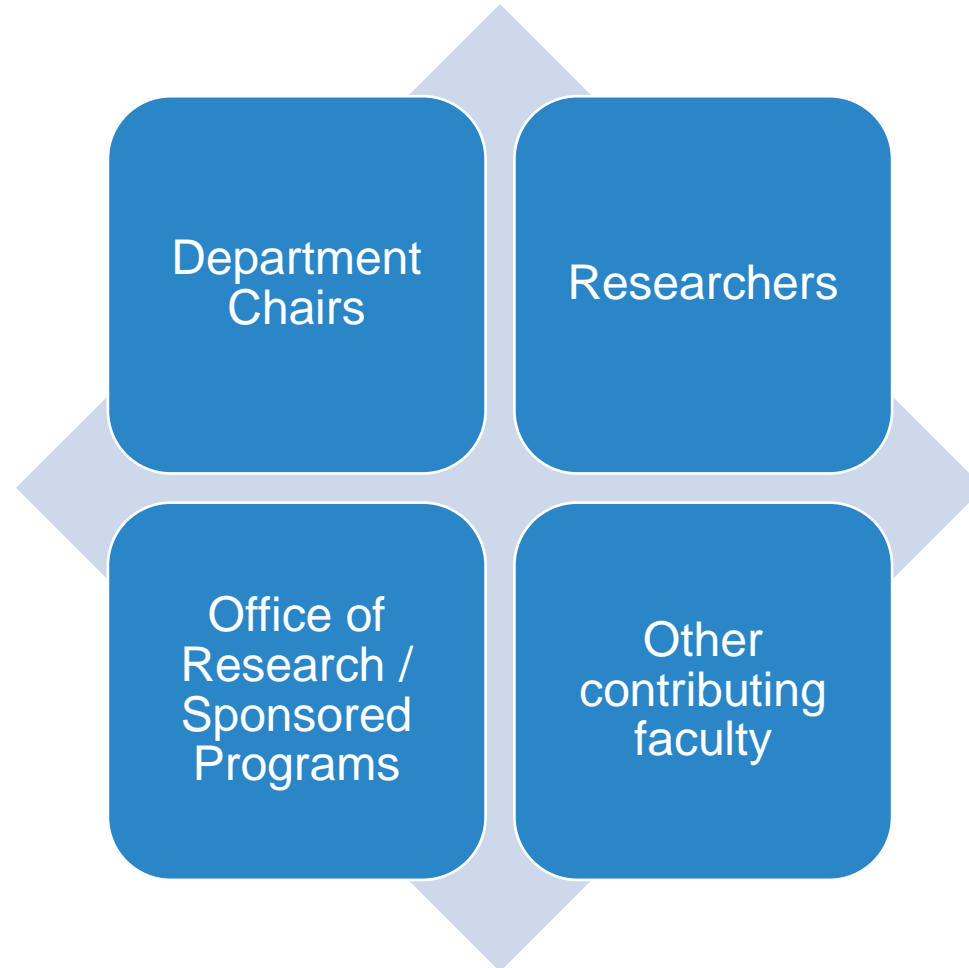
- Attendees discussed research needs in areas such as Traffic Safety, Structures, and Roadway
- Two projects have been presented by researchers for consideration by WVDOT staff and are currently under evaluation
- An online form was presented and evaluated during the sessions

Finance

- SP&R funds are intended for applied research projects
- Funds should be allocated by August of each Federal Fiscal Year
- WVDOT currently has a surplus of research funding that will be beneficial to kick-start the program

Data Collecting

Smartsheet has multiple ways within the program to collect data:

- Online forms
- Document uploads
- Fillable PDFs

Data Reporting

Once data has been collected it can be summarized:

- On the dashboard in Smartsheets
- In an automated report and sent to the form submitter

Data Sharing

- Links can be shared externally
- Multiple permission levels can be set to allow access to data

SFY24 ROAP Expenditures

ROAP funds are disbursed to the County and may be sub-allocated to other agencies for trip purposes. Those trips may be provided by the public transportation system or other provider, such as a private provider or a taxicab.

The purpose of the FY24 ROAP Expenditures SmartSheet survey is to capture trip data from transit systems for the EDTAP, EMPL, and RGP programs from all sources (including trips and expenses from non-transit sub-recipients). Please complete the form for each reporting month for the performance period of July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024. For each category of funding, enter the number of ROAP-eligible trips by type and the corresponding expense. Supporting trip documentation must be attached to the survey to submit it. Required information is marked with an asterisk.

NEW: Fares must be deducted from the ROAP expenditures. A new dropdown question has been added to indicate if fares were collected. If fares were collected, a box will open to report the amount.

The data collected from the SmartSheet will be tabulated and analyzed by IMD in order to demonstrate the impact and value of the ROAP funding to the legislature.

The due date for the reporting each month is 45 days after the month end (example: July 2023 report is due September 15, 2023). Only one report per County/Transit System should be submitted.

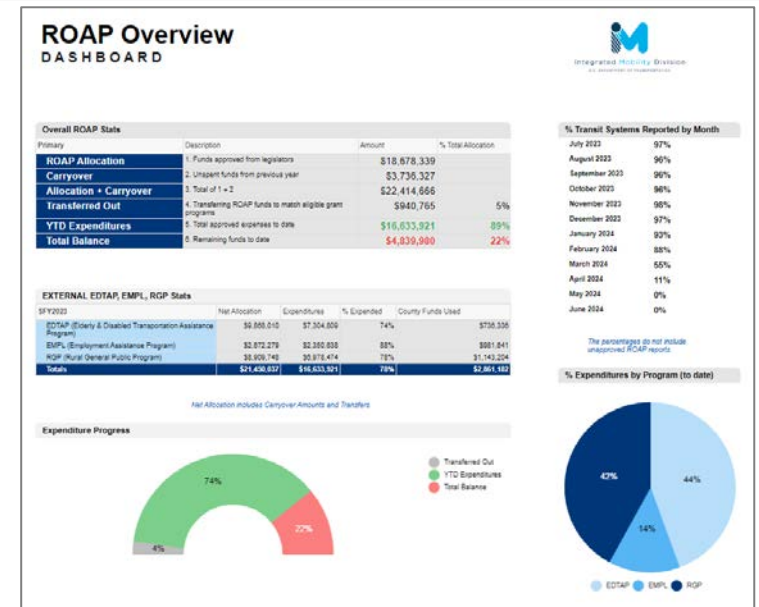

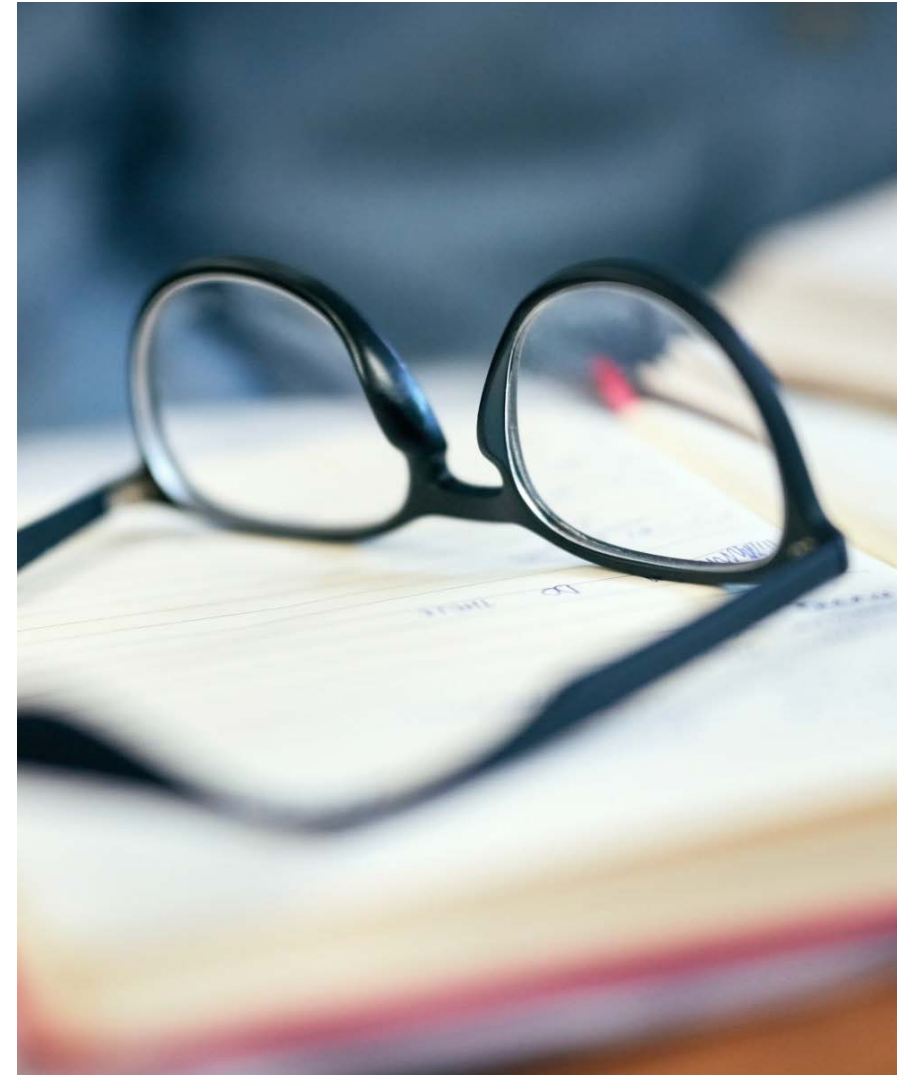
Supporting WVDOT

Research Manual

- Research manual should provide clear information on the WVDOT program and its management
- Updates can occur as the program progresses through its first cycle to capture new and best practices

Implementation Support

- Tech Transfer (T²) programs are critical for turning research into productive tools
- These projects do not have to be WVDOT-funded projects. NCHRP or other state research could be turned into tech transfer

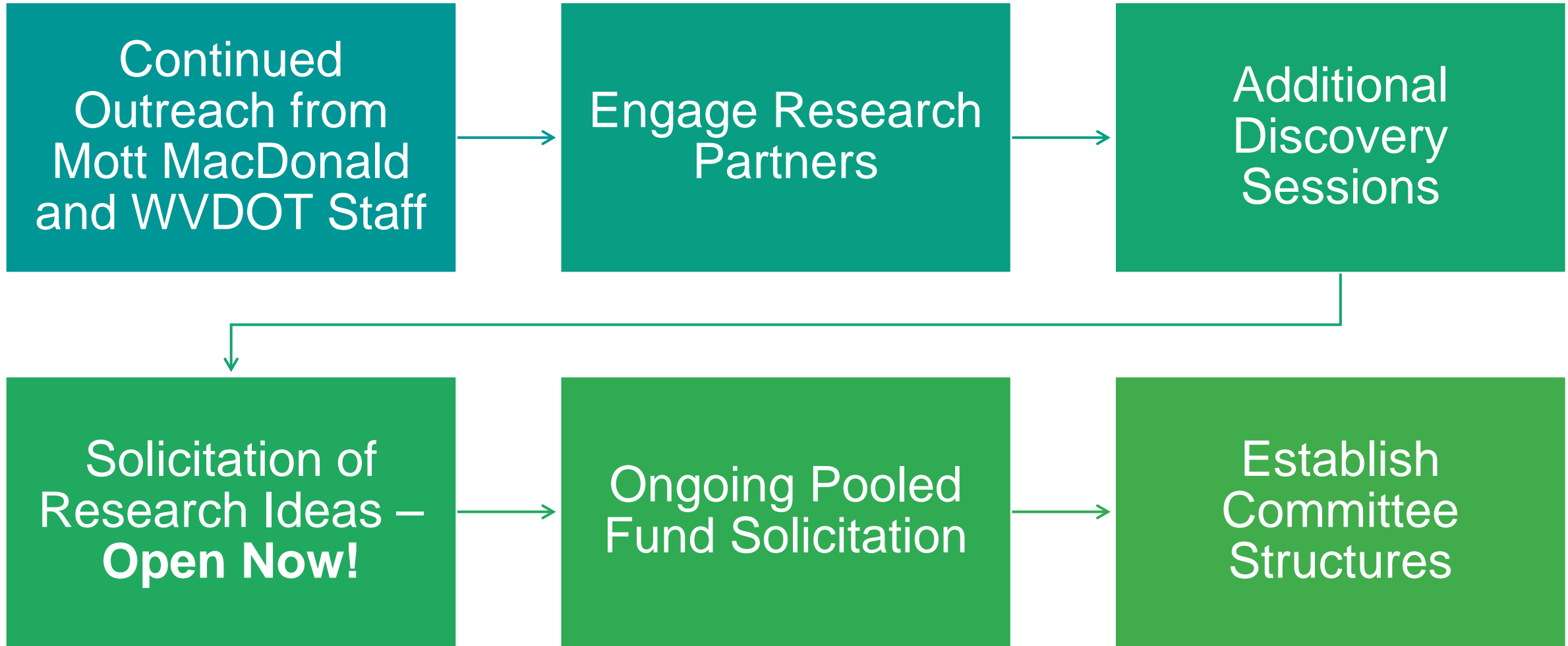
